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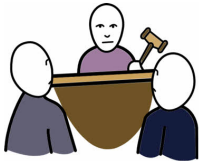

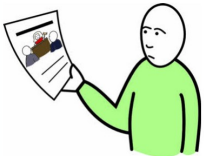
Support in court

We provide advocates to support you through child in need and child protection cases.

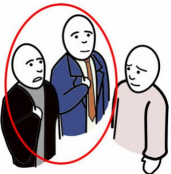
We will
